

Alexei Lalo, Ph.D.

I earned my first Ph.D. in American studies/ American literature in Moscow, Russia, in 2002; published a book and a number of articles on North American studies. I taught U.S. culture studies, literature, and history at the European Humanities University in Minsk in 1994-2003. In 2004-05 I served as a Rockefeller postdoc scholar at the Center for Cultural Studies, University of California-Santa Cruz. I obtained my second, U.S. doctorate in Comparative Literature, specializing in Russia's cultural history in 2010 (UT-Austin). I have published a monograph, an anthology of literary translations, and ten articles on this subject between 2009 and now. As a postdoc researcher and research administrator at ASU's Melikian Center in 2012-15, I was involved in a number of U.S. government-funded practical exchange and civic education projects dealing with Eastern Europe and Eurasia. In 2016-2018 and in 2019-2020 I taught Russian at CalState-Long Beach and the University of Nebraska at Lincoln, respectively.
