<b>Beginning Russian. Level 1.</b>	<i>Mrs. Iryna Dovzhanska</i>	<b>Mondays - Thursdays,</b> 8:15 pm- 9:00 pm	In this beginner's course, students will learn to decipher the code of print and cursive Cyrillic alphabet, learn basic reading rules and how to use an online and a hard copy of a reference dictionary. Through interactive activities, they will follow a route in a Russian metro, get to know sightseeing places in Moscow, create a family tree, and understand confusing Russian names to help with Russian literature.
	<i>Mrs. Natalia Samokhina</i>	<b>Mondays- Wednesday,</b> 5:00 pm- 5:45 pm	Elementary Russian is a comprehensive introduction to the Russian language with a focus on developing basic communicative skills (speaking, listening, reading, and writing) within the framework of contemporary Russian culture. Students will learn the Russian alphabet, everyday basic vocabulary, and will be able to speak and write about themselves, their families, and their studies at the elementary level.
