### Russian Language Classes for Adults (16+...

<b>Beginning Russian 1</b>	<i>Mrs. Tatyana Ivanoff</i>	<b>Tuesday-Thursday, 7:00 pm- 7:45 pm</b>	<p>The units are organized thematically, and each unit contains dialogues, texts, exercises and other material designed to enable students to read, speak and write about the topic as well as to understand simple conversations. The systematic grammar explanation and exercises in the book enable students to develop a conceptual understanding and partial control of all basic Russian structures. The strong structural base enable students to accomplish the linguistic tasks in GOLOSA and prepares them for further study of the language. The students work through the activities the book will learn to communicate a basic level orally in writing and will be better prepared to communicate in the Russian speaking world outside the classroom. The students will understand the essentials of culture and way of life in Russia.</p> <p>Materials: 1. GOLOSA - a basic Course in Russian, has two books, ten unites each Fourth or Fifth Edition - for intermediate and advanced. 2. Learn Russian The Fast and Fan Way - Second Edition for beginners.</p>
<b>Beginning Russian 2.</b>	<i>Dr. Sergey Ermasov</i>	<b>Tuesday- 6:30 pm to 7:15 pm Wednesday - 6.30-7.15 pm</b>	<p>The beginning course Russian II is designed for students who have limited knowledge of Russian. The course focuses on learning enough vocabulary, basic grammar acquisition and oral skills so that you will be able to communicate effectively in everyday situations. This class will use Dialogues and text on the following topics: family, room and house, city, transportation, shopping, job, day schedule, phone conversation, restaurant and café.</p>

			After this class of Beginning Russian II you will be able to read and write simple texts in Russian, and to perform the following functions: to introduce yourself; talk about everyday routine, studies, work, family; ask and tell time; make and respond to invitations; write greeting cards; go shopping, and place orders in a restaurant and cafe; express your emotions, complain and make compliments.
<b>Intermediate Russian, 1-2</b>	<i>Mrs. Tatyana Ivanoff</i>	<b>Tuesday-Thursday, 6:00 pm to 6:45 pm</b>	This class will cover a variety of topics: family, free time, sports, eating out, etc. Grammar will be explained in an accessible way from Alphabet to verbs of motion. There will be a lot of practice and authentic materials.
	<i>Mrs. Anna Tarasova</i>	<b>Saturday, 10:45 AM to 12:15 PM.</b>	Topics: Introduction. Where you from. City. Jobs. Everyday objects. Numbers 1-100. Family. Hobby. My house. Typical day in the office Colors. Adjectives and adverbs.
<b>Business Russian</b>	<i>Dr. Sergey Ermasov (PhD of Economics)</i>	<b>Class meeting Time:</b> Wednesday, from 7:30 pm to 9 pm	This class is suitable for people with an intermediate level of Russian. Students will learn specifics of Russian business vocabulary, Financial terms, industry-related words, acronyms, abbreviations, legal and economic and financial terms. The class will also discuss some cultural specifics related to doing business in Russia. This class will teach business communication in Russia, including social norms. It would also teach Russian business behavioral psychology.
<b>Advanced Russian</b>	<i>Dr. Sergey Ermasov</i>	<b>Tuesday- 7:30 pm to 9 pm</b>	This course is ideal for students who have a wide Russian vocabulary, know colloquial expressions and idioms, and understand all common grammar rules in Russian. Lessons for advanced Russian language learners who can already speak and understand Russian with a certain confidence. This class will enrich your Russian vocabulary, get used to usual conversational speech, and learn many other interesting things about Russia, Russian history, Russian economics and Russian culture. Advanced Russian includes conversation sessions whose goal is to train oral skills and to increase your vocabulary.

<b>Russian Culture</b>	<i>Mrs. Anna Tarasova</i>	<b>Sunday, 10:45 am to 11:30 pm.</b>	The class will discuss Russian tradition, customs, history, literature, and music. <b>The course is taught in English. No knowledge of Russian is necessary</b>
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\*All classes but Russian Culture are twice a week. Cost is \$260/ 24 lessons. Small group size, 2 to 5 students.

Russian Culture class is once a week. Cost is \$135/12 lessons.
